¹Or do you not know, brothers—for I am speaking to those who know the law—that the law is binding on a person only as long as he lives? ²Thus a married woman is bound by law to her husband while he lives, but if her husband dies she is released from the law of marriage. ³Accordingly, she will be called an adulteress if she lives with another man while her husband is alive. But if her husband dies, she is free from that law, and if she marries another man she is not an adulteress.

⁴Likewise, my brothers, you also have died to the law through the body of Christ, so that you may belong to another, to him who has been raised from the dead, in order that we may bear fruit for God. ⁵For while we were living in the flesh, our sinful passions, aroused by the law, were at work in our members to bear fruit for death. ⁶But now we are released from the law, having died to that which held us captive, so that we serve not under the old written code but in the new life of the Spirit.

Sermon

Grace, Mercy, and Peace to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

As we continue sequentially through Romans, the sermons may connect from week to week. Last week, Romans 6 focused on our redemption, our justification, our sanctification. In Baptism, we were baptized into Jesus's death and resurrection, set free to serve our Heavenly Father who calls us out of darkness into His own marvelous light. We serve God in righteousness and are made holy as He is holy. Justified by God's grace, we respond in love by serving God and our neighbor.

Romans 7 focuses on the Law and how the Law applies to the believer's life. From Confirmation Class, what are the three uses of the Law? Curb, mirror, and guide. First, the Law is a curb against gross immorality. For many years, the 10 Commandments were depicted on Courthouses across America. Even in today's "everyone does what is right in their own eyes" (Judges 21:25b) world, where evil is called good and good evil, murder is illegal. Stealing is illegal. God's Law protects lives and property, establishing boundaries for our interactions with one another. Second, the Law is a mirror to show us our sins and our need for a savior. And third, the Law is a guide, telling us how to live as children of God. Which is the greater use? Is it the curb, to keep the world from spiraling out of control into anarchy and disorder? Is it the mirror, so that we know we are sinners who fall short of the Glory of God and need the Gospel to do for us what the law and our own efforts to keep the Law cannot do? Luther's Catechisms show us our need for a savior in the Ten Commandments, then show us our savior in the Apostles' Creed, then how we are to ask our Dear Heavenly Father for our needs in the Lord's Prayer. Or is it the guide, showing us how we are to live as God's own dear children? And aren't all three good?

Yet when we interact with the Law, evil results. The Law exposes, convicts and arouses sin. The Law shows us where we have sinned. The Law shows those around us, where you and I have sinned. The Law points to how and how often we fail. The Law shows us God's intent for how life is to be lived, and we have not lived as God intended. The Law shows we have sinned and fall short of the Glory of God. But the Law offers us no hope for salvation. The Law shows us the problem without offering a solution. We are powerless to break the bonds of sin on our own. Instead, the Law drives us into despair. The Law cannot save us. Instead, we need a savior.

The Law convicts. We sin daily. Sometimes we know our sins. Sometimes our sins are known only to God. We haven't loved the Lord our God with all our hearts, minds, souls, and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We place other gods before the one true God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We sometimes despise God's Word. Sometimes, instead of being the foundation of our lives, our relationship with God becomes another activity, another event, a task to be attended to, to be worked into our busy lives. We stand convicted in our sin.

The Law arouses sin. Knowing what coveting is leads us to covet, to want what God has not given us, be that possessions, talents, or relationships. Too often, we focus on what we are told not to do instead of focusing on what we are to do. We focus on what we know we can't and don't have instead of focusing on what we can and do have. Instead of living as God's child, we live as a child of this world, one whose desire is to have what we want, when and how we want it. We live as we want instead of how God would have us live, loving God and our neighbor. We all know someone, and sometimes it is us, who always wants what they can't have and telling them what they can't have it makes them more desirous and determined to do or have what they shouldn't. For some, that is motivation like no other.

The Law itself is God's Will and Plan for His Creation. In and of itself it is good. But the Law was never intended to be our Lord. The Law was never intended to be our Savior. Listen carefully to Moses's words in Deuteronomy 30 "¹⁵ "See, I have set before you today life and good, death and evil. ¹⁶ If you obey the commandments of the Lord your God^[a] that I command you today, by loving the Lord your God, by walking in his ways, and by keeping his commandments and his statutes and his rules,^[b] then you shall live and multiply, and the Lord your God will bless you in the land that you are entering to take possession of it. ¹⁷ But if your heart turns away, and you will not hear, but are drawn away to worship other gods and serve them, ¹⁸ I declare to you today, that you shall surely perish." What comes first? Loving God, then walking in His ways and following His commandments. In response to God's Love. Not to earn God's love. Not to fulfill the Law for our own good. But in a loving response. How do the Ten Commandments begin? "²"I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery." (Exodus 20:2). God made the first move. God made it possible for Israel to be in relationship with Him. God made it possible for you to be in relationship with Him.

God gives us good gifts in the Ten Commandments. In the First Commandment, God gives us Himself, a loving and gracious God. In the Second Commandment, God gives us His Name, calling us into a personal relationship with Him. And so on. But when we interact with the Law, we are tempted to shape God's Law as we see fit. We bend and shape the Law to determine just how far we can go. We rationalize precise boundaries as the Jews did when they determined how many steps could be taken without violating the Sabbath. We delight in getting away with whatever we can. We sinfully attribute the Law with the power to save. But the full weight of the Law leads us to despair. Our best efforts to follow the Law perfectly fail.

The Law can't save. Only the Gospel saves. Jesus died for your sins, your known and unknown sins. For your sins of commission and omission. For the times you tried to keep the Law thinking that you could or that the Law could save you. For all the times you tried to "sneak in a sin", rationalizing and justifying your actions under the Law.

Fifth Sunday after Pentecost

You are a baptized child of God. You died to sin in your baptism. You were baptized into Christ Jesus's death. You rose to new life. You live in righteousness as a justified child of God who grows in faith by God's Grace and the work of the Holy Spirit. You struggle with the Law, a curb against gross immorality, a mirror to show you your sin and your need for a savior, and a guide for living a Christian life. You are connected to Jesus and the Father for all eternity. The Holy Spirit keeps you in the one true faith to life everlasting, when you will be set free from the Law to love and serve God for all eternity. Amen.

And now, may the peace of God which surpasses all understanding keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus to life everlasting. Amen.
