Sermon

Grace, Mercy and Peace to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

One of my favorite Big Bang Theory episodes is the Bad Fish Paradigm episode. While Sheldon always avoids secrets, Penny shares a secret about her and Leonard's first date. Sheldon couldn't keep a secret, especially from his roommate, Leonard. Long story short, Sheldon moves out of the apartment and in with Raj then Howard to keep Penny's secret. Eventually, Sheldon's annoying personality forces Sheldon back into the apartment with Leonard. Finally, Sheldon blabs Penny's secret that Penny is afraid of being intellectually inferior to Leonard.

Can I let you in on a secret? What response does that statement evoke within you? Are you excited to be in the know? Are you good at keeping secrets? Or are you one, like Sheldon, that can't keep a secret?

Some secrets are harder to keep than others. If the secret is about someone you are particularly fond of, it may be easier to keep. If the secret will hurt someone you love, it may be easier to keep.

This morning, Paul lets the Romans in on a secret. A secret kept from the gentiles for many, many years. But a secret that the Jews knew all too well. A secret that you know all too well.

Of course, it wasn't really a secret. Paul had been spilling the beans all over the Roman Empire. In this doxology to close the book of Romans, Paul prays and praises God for revealing God's Plan of Salvation to the entire world. Paul traces God revealing Himself through the Old Testament into the New Testament and to Paul himself, calling the gospel "my gospel". Indeed, this gospel, hidden from the Gentiles, was evangelized to all people at God's Command. John 20:21-23 "²¹ Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you.' ²² And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld." And Matthew 28:18-20 "⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in ^[b] the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

But every day, God's plan of salvation seems to become a bigger and bigger secret. In America, self-identified Christians are becoming fewer and fewer, down to 63% in 2021 Pew Surveys. The number of people who claim no religious affiliation has increased to 29%. Those percentages were 78% and 16% in 2007. More and more every day, you are increasingly likely to speak to someone who has no idea about Jesus. Even though the world celebrates Christmas every year, the true story, the real reason for the season, is being lost.

While the church may be tempted to wring our hands and cry "woe is me", we are returning to the days and difficulties that the early church faced. Days when Jesus was not accepted in the public marketplace of ideas. Days when the apostles and other Christians faced persecution for their beliefs. Whether you believe government persecution will come in America or not, in the back of our minds, to some extent, that day has arrived. Just this week, after Pope Francis announced blessings for same sex couples, Newsweek published a quote from a British Roman Catholic Cardinal who blasted the US and other countries "I believe that today, Jesus would not be condemned only because he is a Messiah," he said. "He would in Canada or the United States or European countries go to prison because he spoke out the truth about the marriage between a man and a woman."

Under persecution, Christians stood out. Christians made a different in the lives of others. Their beliefs were so important to them that they were willing lay down their lives. The secret that Jesus died for their sins and the sins of the whole world was such good news, they couldn't keep it a secret. They had to tell others. That secret changed their lives. That secret changes your life.

And yet, there are times when we want to keep Jesus a secret. Times when we're not sure the message will be well received. Times when we're not sure that we have the details down pat. Times when we miss the opportunity because we didn't recognize it. Times when we didn't want to be the odd man out.

But the truth always comes out. In Luke 19(38-40), during the Triumphal Entry, the disciples are rejoicing and praising God as Jesus enters Jersualem, "³⁸ saying, "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord!

Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" ³⁹ And some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples." ⁴⁰ He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the very stones would cry out."

Sometimes, when you least expect it, the Holy Spirit speaks the gospel through you. Times when you don't want to. Times when it just feels awkward. Times when you are so afraid of making a mistake, of blowing the only chance. But the Holy Spirit not only gives you the words but causes those words to work faith in the hearer. Isaiah 55:10-11 is in play "For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven and do not return there but water the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, ¹¹ so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it.

And what exactly is the secret? In Paul's words to Timothy (1 Timothy 1:15)" ¹⁵ The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost". Paul had just confessed to being a blasphemer, persecutor, and insolent opponent. What are your big sins? Coveting God's gifts that have not been given you? Having other gods to whom you turn for all good things and in times of trouble? Misusing the name of the Lord your God? Not being in God's Word and prayer? Failing to respect authorities? Not caring for others? Misusing your sexuality? Taking things that aren't yours? Gossiping or not explaining the actions of others favorably? Jesus died for Paul's sins, most of which sound much worse than your sins and my sins. And Jesus died for your sins. No matter how big or small. No matter how frequent or infrequent. Not to give you permission to sin. No. Not at all. But instead, 1 John 2:1-2 "My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. ² He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world."

The secret is out. Jesus died for your sins and the sins of the whole world. Jesus reconciled you to the Father. And that Good News is far too good to keep to yourself. That Good News can't be kept to yourself. That Good News assures you that your sins are forgiven, and you will spend eternity with God. Amen. The peace of God will keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus to life everlasting. Amen.
