### Sermon

Grace, Mercy, and Peace to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Most of us have gone through something that caused us to re-evaluate our lives. It may have been a near death experience. It may have been a death. It may have been a mid-life crisis. We've gotten older and hit a birthday that causes us to stop and think "Is my life what I thought it would be?" For me, those are usually the 5 birthdays, 45, 55, and soon enough 65. For others, it is 0 birthdays, 40, 50, 60 and so on.

In today's Epistle, Paul re-evaluates his life. From a Jewish perspective, he was a dedicated, disciplined follower of God's Law, with lots of trophies, lots of medals, if you will. Lots of proud accomplishments. And

then, Paul gets knocked off his high horse while traveling to Damascus to show his fierce opposition to and to persecute the Christians. Then Paul meets Jesus. And that changes everything. Jesus changes everything.

Throughout Paul's ministry, Paul faced off with the Judaizes, those who taught that following God's Law led to salvation. Judaizers wanted the early church to remain faithful to God's Law to earn their salvation. In the minds of the Romans, Christianity was a sect of Judaism, just as the Pharisees and the Sadducees were. Jesus was a devout Jew, but with a big difference. Unlike you and I, Jesus could and did follow God's Law completely. Jesus had to follow God's Law completely so He could die to be our substitute. That is what God sent Jesus for. To die for your sins and my sins and this sins of the world across all time. To be the all-availing sacrifice, the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world as we will proclaim in the Service of the Sacrament in a bit. Your righteousness before God is solely God's Work. On the other hand, your righteousness before man is your work. You are to be righteous with each other, to love and serve each other. These are the good works in Ephesians 2:10 "<sup>10</sup> For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them." following Paul's explanation of how you become righteous before God in verse 8-9 " For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, <sup>9</sup> not a result of works, so that no one may boast.

When we reflect on our lives, we see our sinfulness. When we wanted more and were not content with what we have, especially relationships and possessions. When we placed our wants over the needs of others. When our lives in this world were more important than eternal life. When we trusted in things and ourselves more than God. When we got our priorities wrong and focused on things other than God's Word and Sacraments. When we fell short of loving God and trusting God for all that we need for this life. When we lacked the discipline to be a disciple. When we sat back and rested on our laurels instead of being on God's Mission with urgency, knowing that the time is short.

Paul doesn't rest on his laurels. Paul is a well-disciplined disciple. Paul responds to his relationship with Jesus, assured of his own salvation. Paul is not trying to earn his righteousness before God. Paul's justification is certain. God provides everything that Paul needs for this life and life everlasting. God made the first move. God sent His Spirit to bring Paul to faith, just as you and I were brought to faith. God called Paul to be baptized, just as you and I were called and baptized. Paul worked in God's Kingdom, on God's Mission of Salvation. And God has work for you to do. You are uniquely gifted. God places you in unique relationships. The Holy Spirit gives you unique opportunities to tell others about Jesus. Hymn 826 Hark, the Voice of Jesus Crying verse 2 says it well:

2 If you cannot speak like angels,

If you cannot preach like Paul,

You can tell the love of Jesus,

You can say He died for all.

If you cannot rouse the wicked With the judgment's dread alarms,

You can lead the little children

To the Savior's waiting arms.

How does this apply to your life? First and foremost, salvation, justification, is a freely given gift. God knew mankind would sin. God created you to save you from your sins. God sent Jesus to be like you in everything except sin. Jesus fulfilled the Law yet died on the cross to be your substitute. The perfect for the imperfect. God raised Jesus from the dead to show He had conquered sin, death and the devil. Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 15:20-22 "<sup>20</sup> But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. <sup>21</sup> For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. <sup>22</sup> For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive."

In Baptism, like Paul, Christ Jesus made you His own (Philippians 3:12). You became God's dear child, an heir of everlasting life. Baptism is God's Work alone. Most of you were baptized as a baby. You couldn't contribute or mess it up. Thus, as Peter writes in 1 Peter 3:21-22 "<sup>21</sup> Baptism, which corresponds to this [referring to Noah and the flood], now saves you, not as a removal of dirt from the body but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, <sup>22</sup> who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers subjected to him."

Paul set an example for us. Paul doesn't take his faith for granted. Paul knows that it takes discipline to be a disciple of Jesus. Paul has turned his back on the very things that were his religion, those things which had previously brought him joy and confidence. Paul had been taught that he was responsible for his faith and Paul took that very seriously, both before and after. What lies in the past, before his conversion, remains in the past. Those sins have been forgiven. In 1 Corinthians 15:9-10, Paul writes "<sup>9</sup> For I am the least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. <sup>10</sup> But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me." God poured out His grace on Paul. Paul doesn't fret or get bogged down with the past. Paul looks forward. Looking forward to serving God, being drawn closer to God, and in the end, everlasting life. Paul knows the gift of God's grace through Jesus Christ our Lord is his salvation. And in response, Paul presses forward. He doesn't take his faith for granted.

You are a forgiven child of God, by the grace of God. God calls you to press forward, loving God and your neighbor. The Holy Spirit moves you to be in God's Word and Prayer. The Holy Spirit leads you to repent and confess your sins and receive God's forgiveness, for the sake of Jesus who died and rose for your salvation. In joyful response, you love God and your neighbor as you press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus. Amen.

May the peace of God which surpasses all understanding guard your heart and mind in Christ Jesus. Amen.
