Sermon

Grace, Mercy, and Peace to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

We've all heard the saying "You can't see the forest for the trees". For some, it is chronic problem. We lose track of how we got into the situation. We dive so deep into the details, the weeds, that we lose track of what took us into the weeds to begin with. I am very prone to analysis paralysis. I'm task and detail oriented. The drive to finish a task can lead me into trouble when a problem, a challenge, arises. I can get stuck on the problem and can't figure it out. I'll often churn on the problem, taking much more time than I should. And often, if I step back from the problem, or sometimes just get distracted, the answer becomes obvious. For example, I helped a friend remove a starter from his car. He had been under there for hours, unable to muscle that last, pinched, bolt out. The harder he tried, the more frustrated he became. His language got worse and worse. Tools began to fly. There was a simple solution. Lift the back of the starter to relieve the pressure on the bolt and viola! But he was too close to the problem. He couldn't see what was going on.

In 2 Peter 3, scoffers, skeptics, were stirring up trouble. They saw the earth as permanent and indestructible. They were probably doing quite well in the world, so to speak, enjoying heaven on earth. So, the concept of life after death didn't make sense to them. They couldn't see the end of the world happening.

As we have heard from Ecclesiastes over the past couple of weeks "There is nothing new under the sun." Without God's Word, our corrupted thinking causes us to believe that sun will always rise again. But our human logic is flawed, corrupted by sin.

Today, many only believe what they can see and understand. Mankind believes that a rational, scientific understanding of the creation is the way things are. Scientists have developed the theory of Evolution. The Evolutionists can't wrap their heads around a 6-day creation and an all-powerful God that could and did create all things. They point to things that appear to be much older than 6,000 years. But God didn't have to create

everything immature. For example, God created Adam as a full-grown man, not as an infant. When God created Adam, there were plants mature enough to feed Adam. So, could God create something that appears to be millions of years old when it is only 6,000 years old? Absolutely. Sounds like the chicken came first, eh?

God has acted in history as recorded in the Bible. God had Noah build the ark before God flooded the earth, to save a faithful remnant. God called Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob to be His own. God rescued Israel from Egypt. God gave Israel the Ten Commandments. But before Moses could come down Mount Sinai with the Ten Commandments, Israel began to worship a Golden Calf. Despite Israel's sins, God showed His steadfast love and brought Israel into the promised land. Israel again and again turned their back on God. As we heard on Wednesday evening, the Northern Kingdom was carried into exile by the Assyrians and would never again be its own sovereign nation. The Southern Kingdom would be carried into Babylon and after 70 years, a faithful remnant would return to set the stage for Jesus to come. Jesus, the long-awaited Messiah, was rejected by the Jews and died on a Roman cross for the sins of the whole world. Jesus died on the cross and rose on Easter from the dead, conquering sin, death, and the devil. Before Jesus ascended into heaven, Jesus gave His Church the Great Commission "¹⁸ 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in [b] the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:18b-20).

God had a plan from before creation. God created us to save us. God knew that sin would corrupt His perfect creation and that Jesus would die on the cross to pay for the sins of all mankind. As His plan was to save, God is patient, not wanting any to perish. God wants to save all mankind but knows that some will reject Him. And even those who reject God, God continues to call to repentance and into relationship with Him.

We never know when our last breath will be. Will I go to sleep and never wake up? Certainly, many have died that way. Will my life be ended by a car accident? Will I have a heart attack? Or will I languish in a nursing home of a terrible disease that will ultimately end my life?

This life is temporary and fleeting. We may enjoy a life that the world envies and be miserable. We may have everything going for us and be troubled by doubt and anxiety. We may have lost sight of the Gracious God who controls everything and have replaced Him with something earthly. Our relationship with God and with others may be strained or broken. In response to God's great love, grace, and mercy, we are called to be ready when the Lord comes again. We are to use the Law, the Ten Commandments, as a guide. We are to live as God created us to live, serving God and one another. Hebrews 12:1-2 "12 Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, ² looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God." Being a faithful child of God and walking in God's ways is challenging and impossible. I can't be perfect as my heavenly Father is perfect. You can't be perfect as your Heavenly Father is perfect. But we can repent by the power of the Holy Spirit, and having confessed our sins, be forgiven.

Despite your sin, God loves you. God is patient with you, wanting you to come to the knowledge of the truth and be set free. God wants you in a loving relationship with Him and those around you. God sent Jesus into this broken, sinful world, to take your sins to the Cross and pay the full atonement price. Jesus died so that you will not face God's wrath for your sins. Jesus has already faced the punishment for your sins and has set you free. You are no longer a slave to sin, but a slave to righteousness. God pours out His blessings on you, in this world and in eternity. And so, it is for you and I that God delays the end of the age. God truly wants you in His Kingdom that has no end.

It is easy to get so involved in this world that we can't see eternity that lies before us. We sometimes can't see eternity and its great rewards because of this world. Yet, Jesus died for you. Your eternal life is assured. Only

you can separate yourself from the love of God. And so, be prepared for God call you into His Kingdom when He reclaims His corrupted creation. And then you will be with God for all eternity. Amen.
