Sermon

Grace, Mercy, and Peace to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Back in April 1987, what many thought was unthinkable happened, changing my life forever. My employer eliminated smoking in its buildings. Government mandated warnings began in 1965 and began carrying the Trinity Lutheran Church, Harvel, IL 5 Pastor Nehring

Surgeon General's name in 1970. Cigarette advertising was banned in 1969. But that hadn't stopped me from starting to smoke. Both of my parents smoked. Smoking was cool. And sneaking around to smoke made it every cooler. Years later, a choice had to be made. Do I quit every Monday, or just that one Monday?

Many smokers will tell you quitting is easy; they have done it many times. It is staying quit that is hard. Either the nicotine, the addictive ingredient, or the habit called out for a smoke. For example, some had to smoke while they were drinking. For some, finishing a meal caused a craving. Often, these triggers would lead them back into their habit. I've also known people who could take or leave cigarettes, almost as if the habit or the nicotine were not addictive. But for me, staying quit meant never, ever picking up a cigarette or any other form of tobacco. Cigarettes were, for me, a bad habit with a continual attraction.

Isn't the same true of sinning? Haven't we all, many times, tried to quit sinning? Especially our pet sin. The sin we've been trying on our own to overcome for years. Perhaps a sin that if anyone ever found out, you'd be too embarrassed to show your face. That sin that you work hard to keep hidden. Maybe something you see or watch on the internet. Maybe how you spend your time. Maybe failing to put others words and actions into the best possible light. Maybe having your own god or gods. Maybe putting yourself ahead of the needs of others.

The devil, the world and our sinful nature make sin attractive to us. The devil, the world and our sinful nature tempt us. And even when we resolutely repent and turn back to God, sin still calls out to us. We know sin is not good for us, but we are still attracted. We know "the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 6:23).

In Romans 6, God worked your salvation; Jesus conquered sin, death, and the devil for you. Before your baptism, you were a slave to sin, an enemy of God. Your every thought, word, and deed opposed God. Yet God loves you. God wants what is best for you. God didn't create you to remain his enemy forever. So, God sent the Holy Spirit to work faith in you through the hearing of God's Word. God called you to be baptized, to die with Jesus, and to arise to life, a life of righteousness which you could never accomplish on your own. Jesus paid your sin debt. Jesus cured your uncurable sin sickness. You have been justified, made righteous, by Jesus's all-availing sacrifice on cross for your sins. You are free to serve God in righteousness, a righteousness that you could never choose for yourself, a righteousness you wouldn't choose for yourself. Jesus willingly died for your sins, opening the gate of heaven to you, to all people. You are justified by faith in Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.

Once justified, made righteous with God, your sanctification begins. Your being made holy begins. Luther carefully taught the distinction between justification and sanctification. The Holy Spirit is key in both. Your justification is a freely given gift. Your salvation is a gift of God, graciously and mercifully given. You can't improve it. You merely receive it. You, on your own, cannot accept it. But, you could reject it. You could tell God that you don't want his Grace. That you don't want his Holy Spirit to build and strengthen your faith. On your own, you can't desire or ask to faithfully proclaim Jesus the Lord of Creation who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light.

Sanctification, on the other hand, is your being made holy, set apart from sin, to be holy as your Heavenly Father is holy. Sanctification is actively living as you were created to live, actively living as God's child. Sanctification is being God's instrument of righteousness, not God's enemy, an instrument of unrighteousness. Before being justified, before being made righteous, you had no choice. You could only be an instrument of unrighteousness. You were a slave to sin, unable to choose or seek God. But now, by the grace of God, you are a servant of righteousness. Yet, sin is at hand, luring you to return to being a slave to unrighteousness, to being an enemy of God.

Everyone serves and worships something or someone. We serve ourselves, our pride, our finances, our relationships, our country, our government. When we place our trust in any of these things, we turn our back on

God. Each false, created god, will ultimately fail, will let us down. God, on the other hand, will never let us down. When God speaks, things happen, things come to be. God spoke and creation came to exist. God Word speaks and faith comes to be. Our relationship with God comes to be. Our justification comes to be. Our sanctification comes to be.

The god one worships comes with consequences. Serving anyone or anything but the one true God leads to death and eternal condemnation. The people of Israel asked for a king so that they might be like other kingdoms instead of being satisfied with God as their king. The people of Israel sought after other gods, turning their back on the one true God. And so, God gave them over to the other gods they sought, as Jeremiah proclaimed.

Sin separates. Sin divides. Sin separates us from God, from one another, and even separates our bodies and souls. All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. We don't love God with all our hearts and minds and strength. We don't love our neighbor as ourselves. We serve other gods, turning our backs on the one true God.

But God is not content to leave you in your sins. Jesus died for your sins, my sins, and the sins of all people. God makes the first move, calls you to faith by the Holy Spirit and the Word of God. God calls you to become God's own dear child in baptism. The Holy Spirit works repentance in your heart, calls you to confess your sins and receive forgiveness. God who is faithful and just will forgive your sins and keep you into a loving relationship with Him. The Holy Spirit will guide your heart and mind to a faithful and loving response to the great gift of salvation earned by Jesus on the Cross. The Holy Spirit guides your actions in righteousness as you love and serve God and your neighbor. The Holy Spirit sanctifies and keeps you in the one true faith with Jesus Christ.

Just as my employer set me free from tobacco, God set you free from sin by sending Jesus to die for your sins. While tempted to go it alone, God provides the Holy Spirit to lead you in paths of righteousness in a loving response to God's love, grace, and mercy. And God is with you, giving you strength and courage to avoid temptation and lead lives of righteousness. With the help of the Holy Spirit, offer your members in righteousness to serve and glorify God. Choose righteousness over unrighteousness. Resist choosing unrighteous, knowing that when you fall into sin, repentance and confession lead you back to God who forgives your sins and restores your righteousness as you become holy through the work of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
