Sermon

Grace, Mercy, and Peace to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Have you ever thought to yourself "what have I gotten myself into"? The negative possibilities are endless. It could be a wrong turn, leading you somewhere sketchy, somewhere you wouldn't otherwise go. It could be not wanting to say no. Everything starts off well but goes south quickly, as you feared. It could be buying a car or a house or what have you that has one problem after another. But there can be positive possibilities as well. Perhaps you hate to leave home but find yourself having a great time once you do. Or maybe you weren't 100% sure about a purchase or a commitment and things worked out even better than you hoped.

Today's Epistle tells us what we have gotten into. Better yet, we have been called into. When you were born, what choices did you have? Did you get to choose which parents you got? Did you get to choose your gender or your race? Of course not. God had a plan for you as Jeremiah wrote (29:11) "11 For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope." Hear the words of Psalm 139:13-16 "13 For you formed my inward parts; you knitted me together in my mother's womb. 14 I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. [a] Wonderful are your works; my soul knows it very well. ¹⁵ My frame was not hidden from you, when I was being made in secret, intricately woven in the depths of the earth. ¹⁶ Your eyes saw my unformed substance; in your book were written, every one of them, the days that were formed for me, when as yet there was none of them." God still has a plan for you. God sent the Holy Spirit to work faith in your heart and to call you to the waters of Baptism to be His own dear child. In the waters of Baptism, your old Adam was drowned, put to death, and a new spiritual you was born. A spiritual baby who needs spiritual milk, just as a newborn baby needs her mother's milk. As a baby grows, more solid food is introduced. More independence is learned. More freedom is granted as the child grows and becomes an adult. Yet, every parent knows that they are a heartbeat away from heartbreak. Wise parents and grandparents and aunts and uncles lift up their children in prayer daily, asking God to protect their children from evil and the temptations of this world. Yet, too often, as parents, we end up asking our children and grand children "what have you gotten yourself into?"

While you didn't have a choice as to which family you were born into, your family nurtured and shaped you into the person you are today. Family gives us heritage. Family gives us identity. Our early years to shape our life. Often, families create those "what have I gotten myself into" moments. The sins of the father continue to the third or fourth generation. Sometimes, no matter how hard we try, we still end up making the mistakes that our parents did. And we watch our adult children make the same mistakes. When the grandkids got to be 18, we described a choice that they needed to make. They could choose to be just like their parents or they could choose something different, something better, for themselves. My family's heritage is to have a hair-trigger temper. But that is not what I chose for myself and for my family.

What has God gotten you into? God chose you to be His own dear child. And that makes you special. Hear again the words of 1 Peter 2:9-10 " ⁹But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. ¹⁰Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy." While you are not a descendent of Abraham, you are a member of God's family. Your salvation is assured. You have gone from being an enemy of God, born sinful and unclean, to being a child of God for whom Jesus died on the cross reconciling you to God. By yourself, by myself, we are nothing special. But when God chooses you, you are someone special. We are part of God's royal family. We are part of a holy nation, a people chosen by God. Yet our sinful nature clings to us, drawing us away from God and back into the darkness of our life before God. Psalm 145:8 says it well "The Lord is gracious and

merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love." And so, when we ask ourselves "what have I gotten myself into", we cling to God's promises of grace and mercy, repent and confess our sins knowing that He will forgive our sins.

You are a part of God's Church, God's Temple here on earth. Not a physical building like the Temple of Jerusalem that was destroyed completely by the Romans in 70 AD, making sacrifices for sins impossible. Sacrifices for sin are no longer needed. Instead, God sent Jesus to pay the ultimate price, a price that all the sheep in the world can't begin to pay for your sins. Jesus took your sins to the cross and paid your debt in full. Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. Jesus reconciled you to the Father. And in response, you are a living stone who makes up God's Church in the world. And as God's Church, by the power of the Holy Spirit, you grasp the promises of God through Jesus Christ. You cling to the promises of God through Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit works faith in your heart which cling to the promises of God. And we have God's promise, especially the end of verse 6 "and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame."

When you find yourself asking "what have I gotten myself into", know that God is always beside you, seeing you through those challenging times. Know that you deserve only temporal and eternal punishment for your sins of not putting God first in your life. For not loving God and neighbor more than yourself. For coveting and trying to take what you have not been given, be that relationships, possessions, or reputation. For being caught up in worldly desires. For not being focused on God and being rooted in His Word.

God has gotten you into situations where you are to be a faithful witness. God brings you into situations to trust His provision. God brings you into situations to share your faith with those around us, family, friends, and total strangers. You serve a gracious and loving God whose mercies are new every morning. God has chosen you to be His own dear son or daughter. God has made you part of His family. God sets you apart to serve Him. God wants what is truly best for you. God calls you to set sin aside and be His hands and feet to shine His light into this sin darkened world. God calls you to be with Him for all eternity because Jesus died for your sins. We await the last day when you will be made imperishable and immortal and will reign with God for all eternity. Amen.

And now, may the peace of God which surpasses all understanding keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus to life everlasting. Amen.
