Sermon

Grace, Mercy, and Peace to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Who are you? How do you define yourself? In today's "anything goes" world, one has wide liberty. The world no longer restricts people to two genders, male and female. Men especially have midlife or identity crises. According to the world, one can be whatever one wants. And to some extent, that is true. Countless people have broken new ground as the first of their family to go to college, or get a Master's Degree, or a doctrate. Some have become billionaires; some more than once. Some have risen in Corporate America to lead international companies. 45 people have been elected President of the United States, and only twice have two presidents been father and son. Others were born into a wealthy family and end up on the street. Some recover from substance abuse and then relapse. Others succumb to crime and fall from their lofty positions. Numerous religious leaders have found themselves abandoning God's call to pursue fleshly desires.

What about you? Does your faith define you? Does living in America define who you are? Are you a Christian American or an American Christian? Does your birth family define you? Or if you were adopted, did your adoptive parents define who you are? Does your work define you? Do your relationships define you? Were you blessed to have parents that you wanted to grow up to be just like? Or was your relationship with your parents strained, leaving you to want to be the opposite? For example, my Dad had a hair trigger temper such that my birth family walked on eggshells constantly, in fear that we would trigger Dad's temper. Or was substance abuse part of your family? Or physical abuse?

In today's Epistle reading, Paul focuses on your life in and through Jesus who suffered and died to redeem you and reconcile you with the Father. The Holy Spirit enables you to put to death the deeds of the body (v13b) and to focus on the spiritual and eternal life. You are not ultimately defined not by sinful nature during your earthly life but by God's action of sending the Holy Spirit into your life, making you an adopted son or daughter of our Heavenly Father. In loving response to this gift of God, you resist sin. Your eternal identity is no longer an enemy of God who deserves temporal and eternal punishment. Your eternal identity is "child of God", heir of God's eternal kingdom, a shared inheritance with Jesus who humbled Himself to be like you in all things but sin. Jesus rose from the dead, assuring you that you too will rise on the last day. Jesus appeared to the disciples, making them witnesses of the Resurrection who faithfully testify that Christ is Risen through the Scriptures, which makes you a witness of the Resurrection.

What does this mean for you, who you are, and your life? God sent the Holy Spirit to you to work faith in your heart. Led by the Holy Spirit through the proclamation and hearing of God's Word, you were called to the waters of Baptism and became God's own dear child. The Holy Spirit transforms you from a poor miserable sinner, a descendent of Adam and Eve whose sin changed everything, to God's child, God's Saint. The Holy Spirit moves you to repent and confess your sins. Your sins of coveting, desiring what you have not been given, be that money, possessions, relationships, or reputation. Sins of wanting to be like God, to be God. Sins of attempting to use the Law to somehow earn your salvation. Sins of not obeying those in authority over you,

be it parents, adults, or the government God has given you to care for you. Sins of failing to care for your neighbor's life, your neighbor's possessions, your neighbor's relationships, or your neighbor's reputation. Sins of not caring properly for your body, God's temple. Sins of not being a faithful steward, managing all you have been given as belonging to God, not as owned by you.

On your own, you can't help but sin, especially in this sinful world where good is called evil and evil is called good. In this sinful world that rejects God's Word. In this sinful world that glorifies sin and evil instead of condemning sin and evil. The sinful world that ignores the importance of marriage and the one flesh union of man and wife. The sinful world that espouses "me first" over putting others first. But that is where the Holy Spirit comes in. The Holy Spirit who testifies with your spirit that you are a child of God, fulfilling Deuteronomy 19:15 "A single witness shall not suffice against a person for any crime or for any wrong in connection with any offense that he has committed. Only on the evidence of two witnesses or of three witnesses shall a charge be established." While the Holy Spirit's witness is certainly sufficient, your spirit too testifies that you are a child of God. You have been changed. You are no longer a child of the flesh whose end is the grave and hell. Instead, you are a child of God who will live forever in the new heavens and new earth.

How does that change your identity? You have been given vocations and relationships which determine who you are. You may be a farmer, a hair stylist, a teacher, or a retiree. You may be a father, mother, grandmother, grandfather, brother, sister, son or daughter. You may be a husband or a wife or even a fiancé. All of these components of your identify stem from your identity as a redeemed child of God. You are first and foremost a Christian, a brother or sister of Christ, an heir of eternal life. And being a Christian, suffering should not be a surprise. After all, what happened to the only perfect human? His brothers and sisters in the faith put Jesus to death, a death He willingly endured, taking your sins and the sins of the whole world to the cross, dying so that you might live eternally.

As Jesus prepared to suffer and die for your sins in the Garden of Gethsemane, He called upon His Father in the same words as your spirit calls out to your Heavenly Father. In Mark 14:36 "³⁶ And he said, "Abba, Father, all things are possible for you. Remove this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will." These words, "Abba Father" in Aramaic and Greek, don't explain one another but emphasize one another. Abba is a term of endearment, a term of closeness, used by children to address their Daddy. Luther writes "But amid these terrors of the Law, thunderclaps of sin, tremors of death, and roars of the devil, the Holy Spirit begins to cry in our heart 'Abba! Father!' And His cry vastly exceeds and breaks through the powerful and horrible cries of the Law, sin, death and the devil. It penetrates the clouds and heaven, and it reaches all the way to the ears of God". Luther also explains your your closeness to the Father in the Introduction to the Lord's Prayer "With these words God tenderly invites us to believe that He is our true Father and that we are His true children, so that with all boldness and confidence we may ask Him as dear children ask their dear father."

Your identity, first and foremost, is a redeemed child of God, an heir of His Eternal Kingdom, a co-heir of Jesus who died for your sins. And in response, you are focused on eternity, and on God's mission and ministry as you await the coming of God's Kingdom and being united with God, your "Abba Father". Amen.

And now may the peace of God which surpasses all understanding keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus to life everlasting. Amen.
