Sermon

Grace, Mercy, and Peace to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

This morning, we celebrate the Baptism of Jesus. We jump from Jesus as a less than two-year-old baby being visited by the Magi on Epiphany, to Jesus at age 30, beginning His ministry. Jesus comes to his cousin John, who leapt in his mother's womb at the sound of Mary's Greeting, who is baptizing and preaching repentance. John sees the disconnect; Jesus doesn't need to repent. Yet, Jesus, true God and true man, comes to be baptized. All the others needed to repent, just as you and I do. It could be said that Jesus came to take those sins upon Himself as He begins his ministry that will lead to Calvary, the grave and Jesus's Resurrection. Without sin, Jesus came to earth, humbling Himself to become human. Without sin, Jesus has no need of

repentance. Jesus remained in perfect obedience to God, our Heavenly Father. But Jesus was sent to fulfill the law, lead the perfect life that you cannot, and to die for your sins. To be the perfect sacrifice to conquer sin, death and the devil. Jesus's baptism, life, death, and resurrection makes all the difference. For Jesus took your sins and the sins of the whole world over all time and made full atonement, dying that you might live eternally.

At the end and the beginning of each new year, many pause to ponder what went well and what didn't. This pondering leads to resolutions, attempts to establish good habits, to shore up weaknesses or address problems and challenges that arose in the past. The calendar change prompts introspection and spurs us to change.

The Church Year brings key events in the life of Jesus into view, allowing the church to ponder, consider, evaluate and repent in one's relationship with God. The church year begins with Advent, anticipating Jesus's coming, both as the Babe of Bethlehem and again on the last day. On Christmas, we celebrate Jesus, the greatest gift ever given. Then into Epiphany, God showing Jesus as His Christ, His Messiah, to save all people from their sins. Then Lent, a solemn season of repentance and preparation for the Great three days of Easter, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter. Then the Easter season celebrating Jesus's Resurrection leading to His Ascension and the age of the church, beginning with birth of the Church on Pentecost. For the remainder of the church year, we celebrate the time of the church. We consider how both the early church lived and the church now lives in God's Grace and Mercy, through the power of the Holy Spirit who keeps the church in Jesus Christ, her Head.

The Holy Spirit works through the Word, the written scriptures, and the spoken Word, proclaimed publicly by Pastor and proclaimed by every believer as one goes about daily life, interacting with those God has placed in our life. The Holy Spirit calls us to the waters of Baptism where we are "baptized into Christ Jesus", God's perfect sacrifice for your sins, my sins, and the sins of the whole world.

Your baptism makes all the difference. In your Baptism, you went from being a slave to sin and death, an enemy of God, to being an adopted child. From facing eternal condemnation, eternal separation from God, eternal punishment to an heir of God's heavenly kingdom who you will praise and worship God as you were created to do for all eternity. God, in His grace and mercy, forgives your sins, the times when you turn away from Him, and calls you to turn back to Him. Times when you serve yourself and things of this world. Times when you fail to pray, praise, and give thanks. Times when things of this world overshadow the things of God. Times when you fail to love your neighbor as yourself. Times when you covet, desiring things God has not given you.

Having taken on human flesh, Jesus is your big brother who always beside you. Who always has your back. Who protects and defends you against all evil and danger. Who pays the debts you create by sinning. Jesus has opened the gates of heaven to you. You have been baptized into Jesus, Jesus's mission, Jesus's ministry, Jesus's conquest of sin and death. Your debt has been paid. You have been bought by Jesus's innocent, bitter suffering and death. You are set free to walk in Jesus's ways, to live according to God's Law as a guide to living instead of a relentless taskmaster who constantly shows your sins, your errors, your missteps. As you focus on Jesus, you walk in His Will and ways, bringing glory to God. Your life shines light into the darkness of sin that shrouds so many today. People lost in their sinfulness, willful enemies of God who seek their own will and ways. People for whom this life is all there is. People who are unwilling to see God has He reveals himself in nature, and in natural law written in the hearts of all. People who instead see creation as evolving through a series of random chance events resulting in the order around us.

While you may be tempted to think "God is in the business of forgiving and I am in the business of sinning, so we're good to go", nothing could be farther from the truth. God is a just God who must punish sin and evil. Yet, Jesus paid the price for all your sins, not to enable lawless and sin, but to restore mankind's right relationship with God, by reconciling us to the Father. Reconciled to the Father, you walk in His will and ways, serving God and your neighbor.

While your Baptism drowns the old Adam, sin still clings to your mortal body. Paul writes later (Romans 7) "For I know that good itself does not dwell in me, that is, in my sinful nature. [c] For I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out. ¹⁹ For I do not do the good I want to do, but the evil I do not want to do—this I keep on doing." But, you cling to God's Word. You cling to the promises of in Baptism. God made you His own dear child. But when the Law accuses, as it always does, Satan seizes the opportunity to lie and deceive

that God's forgiveness is somehow limited. That somehow, you have sinned more than God can and will forgive. But the Law cannot overcome sin. Only God's grace overcomes sin, death and the devil. The Holy Spirit uses the Law to show us our sins and Gospel to show us our savior. As Peter proclaims to the Sanhedrin in Acts 4 "12 Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved." Paul tells the Philippians "Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."

You are a Baptized child of God, an heir of God's kingdom. You are set free from your sins by Jesus's death. Free from the slavery of sin. Free to walk in God's will and ways. Free to praise and worship God. Free to ask your heavenly Father as a dear child asks her dear father. Free to love and serve both God and your neighbor as you await being in God's perfect kingdom for all eternity. And that makes all the difference. Amen.

And now, may the peace of God which surpasses all understanding keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus to life everlasting. Amen.
