Sermon

Grace, Mercy and Peace to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

So often, how we look at things changes our reaction and can change our lives. Have you ever experienced that? I had a pastor explain to me that sermons are like time bombs. Every week, another sermon is set to go off at about 10:20, give or take a few minutes. And for a while, sermons became a "I have to", and writing sermons became more difficult. And at one point, I caught on to the difference that "I get to" instead of "I have to" makes. When "I get to", the task becomes a privilege, a pleasure, enjoyable. I spent most of my life doing "I have to" activities. And I can and will step up and do those "have to" tasks. You've probably heard the saying "if you love what you do, you'll never have to work a day in your life". You won't find yourself bogged down in the "I have to" but instead in the "I get to" which changes everything.

Paul continues to focus on the Christ crucified which changes everything. The Cross is the lens through which Paul viewed life. And the cross is the lens through which we look at life. The Cross changes who we are and how we look at life. The cross changes everything. Jesus changes everything. The theme for the 500th anniversary of the Reformation was "It is still all about Jesus". It is. The whole Bible is about Jesus.

The Old Testament points to, prophesies about Jesus. The Old Testament teaches us the Law, the 10 Commandments, showing us our sins, that we cannot free ourselves from our sins and we need a savior.

The Gospels are the story of Jesus's life among us, born of the Virgin Mary. True God and true man. His sinless life. Yet, Jewish leaders, the religious authorities, those should have seen Jesus as the Messiah, but didn't. Their view, their lens, was distorted, warped by their sinful human nature. Desiring to protect the Law, they lost sight of the Gospel. God was no longer their savior, their redeemer. Instead, they followed the Law, upheld the law, hoping God would restore the kingdom to David. Their relationship was no longer God taking the initiative, but them living by the law, a whole litany of 613 mitzvot, 613 rules, 613 "have tos". Their relationship became about what they could do for God than what God did for them. They tried to be active in their relationship with God being passive, simply receiving the gift of salvation from God who provides all things including our salvation. Before creating, God knew we would sin, be unable to free ourselves from our sinful condition and need a savior to save us from our sins. And God knew how to solve the problem. Jesus. As Paul writes "6 For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly." (Romans 5:6) and "but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8).

The Epistles show how God changed the lives of those called to faith by the Holy Spirit. Those called to believe that Jesus is Lord and Savior. Those who "get to" share the Gospel, to tell others about the life, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus Christ. Jesus took your sins to the Cross to show you God's Glory. Yes, the Cross, "The emblem of suff'ring and shame," (The Old Rugged Cross). The most brutal and humiliating method of execution for the worst of the worst. Jesus, true God and true Man, took the sins of the whole world upon Himself and died that you would not die eternally. Jesus is your priest who sacrificed Himself for you and for me. Jesus is your priest who intercedes for you at the right hand of the Father. And because Jesus is your priest, you have the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation. You are freed from slavery to sin and live in God's grace and mercy which changes your outlook, your perspective, your lens on life.

God is your creator and sustainer who defends you against all evil. You are His; He is your God. God provides all that you need for this life and for all eternity. God gives daily bread to all people, even evil people who have turned from Him to pursue other gods, be it possessions, relationships, finances, or lifestyle. God calls you to faith by the power of the Holy Spirit and calls you to the waters of Baptism to wash away your sins and made you His own dear child and heir of His Heavenly Kingdom. God takes the first step in your relationship and calls you to be His own. And God, through the power of the Holy Spirit, calls you to repent and confess your sins so that you will be forgiven by the Holy Spirit who has called you by the Gospel, enlightened you with His gifts, sanctified and kept you in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. (SC Art 3) That changes everything. See life differently. See life through different lenses, through Jesus colored glasses.

Don't be confused by the world's lack of objective truth and morality. God created with a plan and rules and order in mind. With each of the commandments, God gives you good gifts. In the First Commandment, He give a relationship with Himself as your God. In the Sixth Commandment, God gives you sex, a gift to be shared exclusively by one man and one woman within the estate of marriage. In the Firth Commandment, God gives you life and defines life as beginning with conception and ending in a natural death. In the Seventh Commandment, God gives you good things, possessions, to steward, not own and hoard for ourselves. You get to share God's blessings with those around you, especially those in need. You get to trust God and His plans for you. God loves you so much that He sacrificed His only begotten Son for your sins. God loves you so much that He has a plan for your life, that you may show forth His glory.

Always view your life and the world around you through the lens of the cross. Jeremiah (29:11) writes God's words to the exiles "¹¹ For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans for welfare [b] and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope." You and I see only a small piece of the whole picture. God sees the big

picture, from eternity to eternity. God knows you inside and out. The Holy Spirit intercedes for you in groans too deep for words. God leads you on paths of His making, not necessarily of your making. Man's wisdom pales beside God's. Isaiah writes God's words "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, declares the LORD. 9 For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts." Through the lens of the cross, see God at work in your life. Trust His providence, even when things are bleak. As you face health issues. As you face relationships challenges. As you face the death of loved ones. As you face challenges and disappointments, keep your eyes focused on Jesus and the cross. Through the lens of the cross, see Jesus's love for you that purchased and redeemed you. Know that God is working all things for good, to bring glory to His name and bring you to Himself for all eternity. Amen.
