C Whoever desires to be saved must, above all, hold the catholic faith.

Whoever does not keep it whole and undefiled will without doubt perish eternally. And the catholic faith is this,

that we worship one God in Trinity and Trinity in Unity, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the substance.

For the Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Holy Spirit is another.

But the Godhead of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit is one: the glory equal, the majesty coeternal.

Such as the Father is, such is the Son, and such is the Holy Spirit:

the Father uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated;

the Father infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite;

the Father eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal.

And yet there are not three Eternals, but one Eternal,

just as there are not three Uncreated or three Infinites, but one Uncreated and one Infinite.

In the same way, the Father is almighty, the Son almighty, the Holy Spirit almighty;

and yet there are not three Almighties, but one Almighty.

So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God;

and yet there are not three Gods, but one God.

So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord;

and yet there are not three Lords, but one Lord.

Just as we are compelled by the Christian truth to acknowledge each distinct person as God and Lord, so also are we prohibited by the catholic religion to say that there are three Gods or Lords.

The Father is not made nor created nor begotten by anyone.

The Son is neither made nor created, but begotten of the Father alone.

The Holy Spirit is of the Father and of the Son, neither made nor created nor begotten, but proceeding.

Thus, there is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.

And in this Trinity none is before or after another; none is greater or less than another; but the whole three persons are coeternal with each other and coequal, so that in all things, as has been stated above, the Trinity in Unity and Unity in Trinity is to be worshiped.

Therefore, whoever desires to be saved must think thus about the Trinity.

But it is also necessary for everlasting salvation that one faithfully believe the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Therefore, it is the right faith that we believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is at the same time both God and man.

He is God, begotten from the substance of the Father before all ages; and He is man, born from the substance of His mother in this age:

perfect God and perfect man, composed of a rational soul and human flesh;

equal to the Father with respect to His divinity, less than the Father with respect to His humanity.

Although He is God and man, He is not two, but one Christ:

one, however, not by the conversion of the divinity into flesh, but by the assumption of the humanity into God;

one altogether, not by confusion of substance, but by unity of person.

For as the rational soul and flesh is one man, so God and man is one Christ,

who suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose again the third day from the dead, ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father, God Almighty, from

whence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

At His coming all people will rise again with their bodies and give an account concerning their own deeds.

And those who have done good will enter into eternal life, and those who have done evil into eternal fire.

This is the catholic faith; whoever does not believe it faithfully and firmly cannot be saved.

Sermon

Grace, Mercy, and Peace to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

This morning, we celebrate the Festival of the Holy Trinity, God in Three Persons. Last week, we celebrated Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit, the birth of the Church. But there is much more to Pentecost. Pentecost wasn't just a one and done historical event. Pentecost is the process of the church. The Holy Spirit moves Christians to tell of God's Salvation to those around us, those with whom we interact. The Holy Spirit moves and enables faithful witness. The Holy Spirit gives us the words. And that is not all. The Holy Spirit creates and strengthens faith in the hearer. After all, where did your faith come from? What causes your faith to grow? God's Word, the good news about Jesus, our Lord, and Savior, whom Peter preaches in today's Epistle.

The first and third readings portray the Trinity. Did you hear the three members of the Trinity mentioned in the Old Testament reading? Two are called out in the first two verses. "God created" and "the Spirit of God hovered". But did you hear Jesus mentioned? Go ahead, give the reading a quick scan. Ok. Here's a hint. Look in verse 3. Do you see Jesus there? Maybe your mind jumped to John 1:4-5 "In him was life,^[a] and the life was the light of men. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." But that is not it. Ok. Another hint. How else do we describe Jesus? Jesus is the Word of God. But Word is not in verse 3, is it? Or is it? Jesus is right there in the third word. "And God said…" When God said, He spoke the Word. Jesus is the Incarnate Word of God. John's Gospel begins (1:1-3) "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God. ³ All things were made

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through him, and without him was not anything made that was made." God's Word makes things happen. God speaks and things come into being.

God spoke the whole universe into existence. God spoke you into existence. God speaks your faith into existence. God speaks your relationship with Him into existence. God has spoken your salvation into existence. God speaks your forgiveness into existence through both the Written Word, the Scriptures, and the Spoken Word, spoken by prophets, spokespersons for God.

Do we still have prophets? And if we do, who are they? Let's clarify what a prophet is. A prophet is someone who speaks for God. While our minds tend to jump to foretelling the future, foretelling is a small part. So, "Who speaks for God today?" Hopefully, a Pastor comes to mind. Every Sunday, Pastor expounds on the readings so people have a better understanding and can apply the Scriptures to life. Pastor also stands at the beginning of the service and speaks the words of God's Forgiveness, God's Absolution. Pastors are the keepers of the mysteries who faithfully interpret and proclaim Scriptures, properly administer the Sacraments, and call sinners like themselves to repent. Pastors are public ministers of the Gospel, speaking on behalf of both the local congregation and God. But don't think for a moment that you are off the hook.

You too are called to speak God's Word to one another and to those in your life. You are to speak God's forgiveness. You are called, as Peter wrote "to always be prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you **for** a **reason for the hope** that is in you;" (1 Peter 3:15).

There is also the Gospel reading. Jesus came under the Father's authority to fulfill the Father's will and plan of salvation. Jesus was born of Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate and was crucified so that your sins are forgiven. Jesus came to take your place, to take your sins and give you His righteousness. When God looks at you, God sees His perfect, loving son, Jesus. God sees the Law fulfilled. You are righteous before God as His own dear child, God's child for whom Jesus laid down His life. A child of our heavenly Father who walks in His or her faith knowing that one cannot come to faith without the Holy Spirit acting. A child of God who has God's gift of eternal life. A child of God who cannot save one's self, earn God's favor, or God's Grace or God's Mercy. Your salvation is assured. You are a child of God who wants to be about His Father's Business, a loving response to the gift of your Salvation. What are you to do in response?

Jesus gives us His Authority, which He was given by the Father. God has one purpose in mind, to save sinners. And so, we join Jesus on the Father's Mission. Wherever life leads us, we disciplize, we make disciples. That is our commission, to make disciples. It isn't about going. It is about making disciples. And we are told exactly how to do that. Baptize in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Teach those being discipled all that Jesus taught His disciples on earth. We don't pick and choose. The Bible, the Scriptures, are God's Word. From Genesis to Revelation. From "In the beginning" to "²⁰ He who testifies to these things says, "Surely I am coming soon." Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!" When the Bible makes sense to us and when it doesn't. When we understand how to reconcile Scriptures and Science and when we don't. The Bible doesn't contain God's Word, leaving us to pick and choose, like eating at a Smorgasbord. As Paul wrote to Timothy "¹⁶ All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, ¹⁷ that the man of God^[b] may be complete, equipped for every good work. (2 Timothy 3"16-17). We teach the whole counsel of God. We don't bend God's Word to fit the modern world. We don't leave out the unpopular things. We don't place ourselves over God's Word to determine what is best in the moment. We cling to God's promises. We cling to solid doctrine, even when we don't fully understand it. The Holy Trinity is a mystery. We know the doctrine of the Holy Trinity, One God in Three Persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, yet we don't fully understand. We can't completely comprehend. We accept what Scripture says and teaches as God's Word, the sole source and norm of faith, even when God's Word doesn't make sense to our sin corrupted human mind.

Once a year, we confess the Athanasian Creed which was written to clarify the Trinity, a concept beyond our understanding. We can only understand God as He has revealed Himself in Scriptures. We cling to the clear passages and promises and use those to interpret the difficult passages.

While you can't fully comprehend God, the Scriptures tell you that God loves you and wants you to be His own dear child, purchased and redeemed by Jesus's life, death, and resurrection. Jesus died and rose again that you might have life and have it abundantly. Life that the world cannot give. Forgiveness of sins that the world

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cannot give. Salvation that the world cannot give. As Paul writes "⁹ Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. (Philippians 2:9-10). And so, we struggle with the mystery of the Trinity, one God in Three Persons, assured that we will be with God for all eternity in His Kingdom that has no end. Amen.
